HOW THE QUEST WORKS: First, download the entire packet from the GFWC website (www.gfwccentralor.org) Start at Landmark #1 and in numerical order, work your way through the town of Redmond. At each landmark, match one Historic Woman of Redmond to that Landmark. Continue until you have matched all 12 ladies and landmarks.
